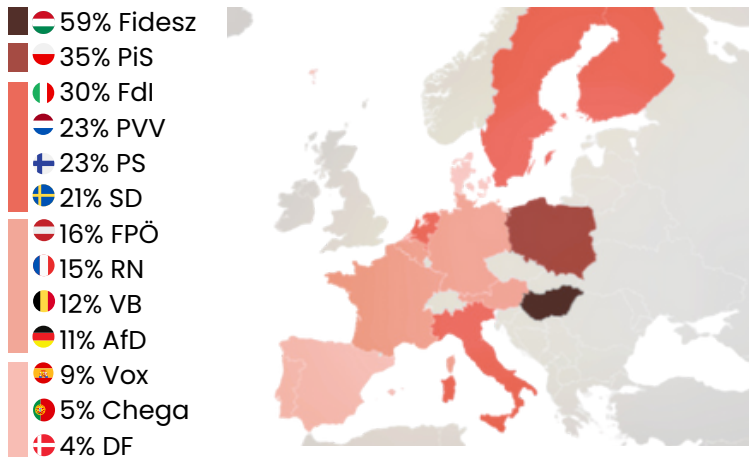


The rise of the far-right wing in Europe

Over the last 10 years, the rise of right-wing populism has reshaped Europe's political landscape: what lies behind this rise in power?

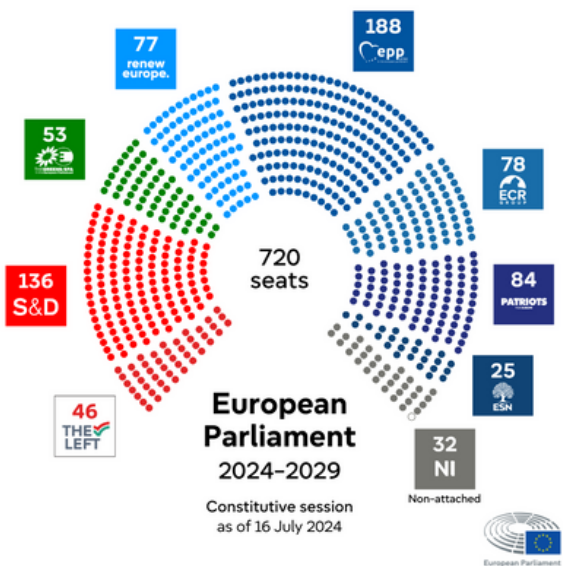

This chart shows the share of seats held by **far-right parties** across **Europe** in **November 2023**.

This populist surge has also been confirmed on a European scale during the most recent **European Parliament elections (June 2024)**, which resulted in a gain of several seats for far-right political groups:

- Patriots for Europe** which includes French deputies from the Rassemblement National and Hungarian deputies from Fidesz
- European Conservatives and Reformists** largely driven by Italy's Fratelli d'Italia.
- Europe of Sovereign Nations** The new political group is primarily composed of German deputies from the AfD.



These parties have capitalised on **fears about immigration, economic instability and cultural identity**, reshaping the European political landscape.

What narratives define Europe's far-right parties?

- Nationalism;
- Economic grievances;
- Anti-immigration;
- Social disconnection and cultural anxiety;
- Conservative family values;
- Opposition to LGBTQ+ rights.

Deconstructing this discourse means analysing their implicit messages to challenge the false narratives that foster fear and discrimination!
